



THE CURRENT REALITY

Russia's invasion of Ukraine changed the game for allied defence investment. NATO countries have recognized that collective security and deterrence depend on sustaining a higher level of defence spending and production across the Alliance. As of now, more than two-thirds of NATO members are spending 2% of their GDP on defence. Canada is not among them. In fact, we rank 27th out of NATO's 32 member-states for overall spending. By failing to meet our commitments or to strategically leverage our defence industrial base, Canada is also leaving crucial economic growth potential on the table.

Throughout 2024, calls for Canada to reach 2% and strive beyond it have grown louder, spreading beyond the traditional defence establishment.

WHAT NEXT?

Working toward spending 2% of GDP on defence will mean:

- 1. CANCEL THE CUTS to DND's budget, which amount to \$810 million in 2024-25 and \$908 million in 2026-27 and beyond.
- **2. START LAYING OUT** in Budget 2025 a transparent, year-over-year fiscal track to get Canada to spending 2% of its annual GDP on defence.
- 3. SIGN firm, multi-year contracts for battle-decisive munitions and other key capabilities with resident expertise in Canada.
- **4. DESIGN AND IMPLEMENT** Defence Partnership Canada, a forum for government and industrial leadership to engage in sustained, strategic dialogue founded on transparency and trust.
